BARBARA STINE

VOLUNTEER EXTRAORDINAIRE

Barbara Stine arrived in Arizona in June of 1973. She had been active with her daughter, Ellie, in dressage with the Westchester/ Fairfield Dressage Association in Connecticut before moving to Arizona with her husband, G. Harry, son, Bill, and Golden retriever, Gina that summer. Barbara immediately made contact with the local dressage group, known then as the Arizona Hunter/Jumper and Dressage Association.

The Arizona Dressage Association was officially formed in June of 1975. Barbara has served on the Board since before the name change, starting in 1974. She has been the Secretary for several terms. She was the Show Manager and Secretary for the 1978 ADA Spring Show at Equestrian Manor and she was the original ADA Futurity Chairman for at least ten years starting in 1976.

Starting in 1982 Barbara was the Newsletter editor for the ADA Centerline until early 2000. She wrote several columns, "Tidbits" and "Tips from the TD" that were often reproduced in other GMO newsletters.

The Barbara K. Stine Volunteer Trophy was initiated in 1988 and she was the first recipient. She also served as the JR/YR sponsor for many years and she has sponsored a perpetual trophy at the Spring Show for the highest scoring JR/YR above first level since 1977.

Barbara is also the ADA Historian. In 1995 she organized the 25th Anniversary Show Program with reminiscences and pictures, as well as a luncheon for all the old timers to get together. In 1996 she compiled a short history of the ADA to be the title page for cookbook "The Feed Bag" that was sold as a fundraiser for the association.

From 1992 until 2005 Barbara stored most of the ADA Horse Show boxes, ribbons, and equipment in her garage in Phoenix. She kept the judges boxes replenished and a complete inventory of ribbons and prizes. She served on the Show Committee for many years as Sponsor and Advertising Chairman. She solicited ads and class sponsorships for the program for three large shows each year and put the official show program together.

Since 1973 until the fall of 2007 Barbara was the ADA Membership Chairman. With the help of her more computer literate friends, she kept tabs on the growth of the association and produced labels and rosters for 34 years.

BARBARA KAUTH STINE OBITUARY

11/26/1932 - 9/15/2019

Barbara Kauth Stine passed away in Tucson on September 15, 2019. She was born in Bronxville, NY, the daughter of Willard L. Kauth and Ruth Zerkel Kauth. She married G. Harry Stine at Colorado College in Colorado Springs in June 1952. Barbara was widowed in 1997 and continued to live in Phoenix until 2012 when her family moved her to Tucson.

Barbara worked as an executive secretary and medical transcriptionist, but is recognized more for her volunteer activities throughout the communities where she lived. In the early years of the National Association of Rocketry(NAR) she was the organizations secretary/ office manger, as well as competition secretary. While her children were growing up in New Canaan, CT she was a Girl Scout Leader and Camp Director, Sychronized Swim Instructor and soprano singer in the community chorus. When the family moved to Phoenix in 1973 she became involved with the Arizona Dressage Association, the Rio Salado Golden Retriever Club, the McConnell Singers and the Valley of the Sun School.

She is survived by her three children, Constance R. Stine of Mesa, Eleanor Stine Masek of Marana, and George W.(Bill) Stine of Carefree, two granddaughters, Jenny Lopez of Tempe and Laura Stine of Paradise Valley, and two great grandsons, Oliver and Bodhi Lopez.

SOME DRESSAGE JUDGES "PET PEEVES"

- Competitors not showing up to the ring on time and /or entering the ring very slowly after the bell has been rung.
- Horses being shown who are not well groomed. For example: wild looking manes (if not braided), dirty dusty, manure or urine stains.
- Riders not knowing their test and not having a reader if they need one; the judge does not care
 either way and does not want you to go off course.
- Arguing with the judge over an error or lameness issue.
- Losing one's temper in the ring.
- Forgetting to pat or praise the horse at the end of a test, and /or looking displeased.
- Overcorrecting or punishing the horse either during, before, or after a test unfairly
- Use of voice like "clucking" repeatedly.
- Looking very unhappy during a test (unless warranted)
- Ill-fitting/ Improper tack: an example would be a noseband that is adjusted too low and too tight
 and more examples: a saddle that slides forward onto the horses shoulders, spurs on upside
 down, Illegal bit.
- Poor turnout on the part of the rider like loose hair, no gloves, or coats that is too tight or much too loose.
- Dirty tack during nice weather, with no mud in sight.
- Not reading your dressage test after your ride before you show under that judge again, or before the next show. Judges put a lot of time and effort into the tests.
- Forgetting to tell the judge and /or scribe your competitor number as you pass by the judges table. Not required but advisable.
- Very large saddle pads or very small ones on the horse/pony.
- Obvious strong counter flexion of the horse especially in corners and on circles. Wrong bend.
- Excessive use of the whip or spurs; and/or the hair worn off the horse's sides, ie: spur marks
- Riding a very inaccurate test, an example: Riding a 20m circle for a 15 m circle.
- Showing horse at an inappropriate level that it is not prepared for.
- Competing a horse that is very fat and unfit or very thin.
- Showing a horse that is very obviously lame: the rider should feel this.
- Rider talking to reader during the test or vice versa (could be unauthorized assistance)
- Trying to sit the trot when it is difficult for you in a test where it is not required.
- Riders really struggling to sit the horses gaits, usually the trot when it is required.
- And lastly blaming the judge (or worse yet the horse) for a disappointing score. We all want to give good marks whenever possible.
- The competitors should know the rules, and rule changes to avoid issues at the competition.
 Good example: Know which tests you can carry a whip in.

- Once the horse has been nominated it is not necessary to pay additional qualifying fees on entries. NOTE: The "Q" Qualifying fee on the show entry refers to Regional Championship qualifying, not to State Championships. Scores are tracked for State Championships, once the horse has been nominated.
- You must be a member of an Arizona GMO by August 31, 2020 to ride in the Arizona State Championship Show. USDF PM Membership is NOT sufficient!

The Arizona State Championships will be held at the Arizona Dressage Association Fall Fiesta Dressage Show, November, 2020 (Exact Dates TBD) at WestWorld of Scottsdale, Scottsdale, AZ.

For scores to count toward qualification for the State Championships, a \$25 nomination fee must be paid for each horse. This fee must be paid before any rides will count toward qualifying.

Since only one horse/rider combination can compete at State Championships, the fee goes toward the horse. Multiple riders may qualify on the same horse if the nomination fee has been paid for that horse. If multiple riders qualify on the same horse, one rider only may compete in the State Championship classes and the concurrent Fall Fiesta show. See State Championship Rule 5.

There are two ways to file your Nomination Form:

- 1. Send the nomination with a \$25 check, payable to Arizona Dressage Association "ADA" to the address listed below.
- 2. Include the nomination and check, payable to ADA, with your show entry to any Recognized show in Arizona--ADA, Tucson Dressage Club (TDC), Road Runner, or CARA Champagne Dressage Show.

Check the current Arizona Dressage Omnibus or ADA and TDC websites for complete State Championship rules. Updates will also be posted on these websites, if required: ADA: www.azdressage.org; TDC: www.tucsondressageclub.org.

ADA Horse & Rider Year End Schooling Show

High Point Award Nomination

Arizona Dressage Association is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization

Each Horse & Rider combination is a \$10.00 nomination fee.

- 1. Both the Rider and Horse Owner *be current ADA members* and have paid the \$10.00 fee *before* the start of a show for scores to count toward the year end awards.
- 2. Each horse/rider/level combination must ride in TWO or more shows and compete in at least TWO classes at each show to have their scores count.
- 3. Riders may compete in two adjacent levels on the same horse, but the horse must be nominated at each level to be scored toward Year End Awards.
- 4. Riders may compete on more than one horse, but each horse/rider/level combination must be nominated.
- 5. A horse may be shown by up to two competitors, but each horse/rider/level combination must be nominated.
- 6. All scores for Year End Awards are tabulated using the HIGHEST PERCENTAGE SCORE earned by each horse/rider/level combination throughout the show year at each level and in each division.
- 7. It is the rider's responsibility to notify the ADA Second Vice President of any changes that affect year-end award status.
- 8. Awards will go to the top four Junior, Adult Amateur and Open Horse/Rider combination at Introductory through Grand Prix Levels.
- 9. Champion may not be won more than two times by the same horse & rider combination at the same level.


